# The AMH Automotive Group Rally of the Bay

This is the fourth year of the AMH Automotive Group Rally of the Bay, which of course continues a long history of the event and hopefully this will be one of the biggest years in recent history.

This rally brings together competitors from both the NSW & Victorian State Championships, the East Coast Classic Rally Series, the Victorian Fiesta Series, the Victorian Grant Walker Parts Excel Series, and the ACT Regional Rally Series – each of which will have their own results and awards (yes that's 6 groups so far ...)

In addition we will, of course, be very happy to accept entries into one of the 3 main competitions from anyone who isn't chasing a Championship or Series and just wants to come along and have some fun in the forest!

The three competitions run concurrently using the same Special Stages that make up the Meeting are:-

- Bay Stages State Championship Permit 6 Special Stages Pacenoted
  Round of the MTA NSW Rally Championship (NSWRC), Hino Geelong Victorian Rally Championship (VRC), East
  Coast Classic Rally Series (ECCRS), Fiesta Rally Series Victoria and Grant Walker Parts Excel Rally Series, open
  to anybody with appropriate CAMS Rally Licence in an eligible vehicle.
- Bay Ramble Multi-Club Permit 5 Special Stages Pacenoted
   Round of the Techworkz ACT Regional Rally Series (ACT), open to anybody with appropriate CAMS Rally
   Licence in an eligible vehicle.
- Bay Meander Introductory Rally 3 Special Stages Roadbook Only

As part of our duty to take care of the road assets the NSW Forestry Corporation and Eurobodalla Shire Council allow us to use we will be enforcing a "No Spin Start" rule ... a smooth start with minimal slip is required. Officials will be monitoring the starts and repeated hole digging will earn a time penalty.

Crews entering the Introductory Rally (Bay Meander) are NOT permitted to do reconnaissance.

For all other crews the event can be run on pacenotes and we have tried to make reconnaissance available to all with extended opportunities for the few weeks prior to the event, and Smoothline notes also available for purchase.

To help us monitor and manage your safety the Rallysafe system is compulsory for all vehicles. We have been using this system for the last few years as a critical part of our Safety management system – and of course the WRC has now seen the light and implemented the same system for the Championship – well done to the boys from Tassie! Rally Headquarters is again at the Coachhouse Marina Resort – and this will also be the location for the presentation party on Saturday night. Food and drink will be available for reasonable prices and we will have plenty of awards

The Ceremonial Start will once again be along the waterfront - but a bit earlier than previously – cars will be sent from 0845 onwards but NOT at 2 minute intervals...

As part of our efforts to make the event as friendly as possible (and a little bit "different") we will be getting crews underway from the Ceremonial Start as quickly as possible so your timecard will give you the due time at TC1 out in the forest – how you spend your time between the Ceremonial Start and your due TC1 time is up to you! At the other end of the day you will be deemed to have finished the part of the event you have entered at the Stop point of your final special stage (still have to get the timecard back to HQ as soon as you can!) And in a first for the NSWRC we will be using Rallysafe to do all the timing for the event, and chrissport.co.nz to display the results – so crews in the car will know their stage time before they reach the Stop point (yes you still need to Stop!)

The roadbook has been checked, all the required permissions from Councils, Forestry Corporation and NSW Police have been received, we are looking for officials (as always), the trophies are being engraved, and we are busily preparing and printing all the paperwork that makes this type of event happen ... now we need YOUR entry (or your services as an official) to make it the event we are hoping for.

We look forward to you joining us for the rally event of the year in Batemans Bay!

#### Article 1 Organisation

#### 1.1 Nature of Event

This Event, to be known as the AMH Automotive Group Rally of the Bay, will be run as a Meeting with three competitions:-

#### 1) Bay Stages - State Championship level permit

- Round 4 of the MTA NSW Rally Championship (NSWRC)
- Round 4 of the 2019 Hino Geelong Victorian Rally Championship (VRC) incorporating:
  - o 2WD Rally Championship
  - o Clubman Award
  - Novice Award
  - o Grant Walker Parts Excel Rally Series
  - Round of the Victorian Fiesta Rally Series
- Round 4, East Coast Classic Rally Series (ECCRS)

#### 2) Bay Ramble - Multi-club level permit

Round 5, 2019 Techworkz Automotive ACT Regional Rally Series
 This competition is open to all comers not wishing to score points in either of the State
 Championship rounds

#### 3) Bay Meander - Introductory Rally

The Event shall be conducted over Public, Private and Forest Roads within the Eurobodalla Shire and Shoalhaven Shire on Saturday 29<sup>th</sup> June 2019.

The Event is a competitive Event, designed to test the skill of the Driver and Co-Driver, and the reliability and mechanical condition of the competing vehicle.

#### NOTE:

- 1. The fields for the various competitions will be seeded into 2 groups and run with appropriate gaps between fields. The sequence of the fields will be:
  - a. Bay Stages & Bay Ramble combined
  - b. Bay Meander
- 2. Different apparel requirements will apply to the various competitions as per the 2019 CAMS Manual and these Regulations. Apparel will be checked at Scrutineering and at random points throughout the rally.

#### 1.2 Authority

The Event shall be held under the FIA International Sporting Code including Appendices and the National Competition Rules (NCRs) of CAMS Ltd, the National Rally Code (NRC), the NSW Rally Competition and Organising Conditions 2019 (NSWC), the Victorian Rally Bulletin 2019(VRB), 2019 Victorian Rally Championship Standing Regulations (VSR), these Supplementary Regulations and any Bulletins or Further Regulations which may be issued by the Organisers and approved by CAMS Ltd.

The Event will be run using A to A timing.

Where there is any conflict between the NSW Rally Conditions and the Victorian Rally Bulletin or Victorian Standing Regulations the NSW Conditions, and these Regulations, will take precedence.







This Event will be conducted under and in accordance with CAMS OH&S, CAMS Safety 1<sup>st</sup> and Risk Management Policies, which can be found on the CAMS website at <a href="https://www.cams.com.au">www.cams.com.au</a>.

# 2.1.3 Servicing

### 2.1.4 Rallysafe

The use of Rallysafe transponders is compulsory for all vehicles entering this Event as it will be used for both safety tracking and event timing / results.

The Rallysafe unit must be powered from a non-switched source. It must be powered up no later than 30 minutes prior to the Ceremonial Start and remain on until the end of the event.

All vehicles other than Competitors in the Bay Meander (Introductory Rally) MUST be fitted with a full Rallysafe install kit prior to the Event – these WILL NOT be available for purchase at the Event.

Bay Meander Competitors may elect on their Entry Form to either:-

- a) Install a full Rallysafe kit; or
- b) Utilise a windscreen mount kit this requires the pre-purchase and setup of a Rallysafe Wiring Loom

All Competitors should be familiar with the Briefing Video which is available in the Competitor section of the Rallysafe website <a href="http://rallysafe.com.au/Competitors-tm/">http://rallysafe.com.au/Competitors-tm/</a>. For this Event the units will operate in automatic mode with Push to Pass enabled (see section 6.4 of these Regulations for information on this function) The cost of hiring the Rallysafe unit is included in the Entry Fees listed for each section of the Event.

NOTE: A \$50 Cash Deposit will be required when collecting the Rallysafe Transponder. This will be returned to you when the Transponder is returned.

Competitors should consider purchasing an indemnity policy for the unit from Rallysafe via their website – the cost of replacing a unit if it should be damaged beyond repair is \$1,800 plus GST which will be invoiced to the user of the unit at the time of its loss. An annual waiver option is also available if competing in multiple Rallysafe using Events during the year.



We are happy to say that, for the third year running, the NRMA has provided the Event with financial support towards the costs of providing the Rallysafe system for all our competitors and course cars.

Their contribution allows us to run the system in a more comprehensive mode, automatically switching modes depending on the units geographical location – which improves the flow of information to both the crews and HQ as the event progresses ...







#### 2.2 Bay Stages

This competition is a round of both the NSW & Victorian Rally Championships and the East Coast Classic Rally Series and will be conducted as 2 Heats.

This is a pacenoted competition however crews may choose to compete using the event provided roadbook, pacenotes they generate for themselves or pacenotes obtained from a 3<sup>rd</sup> party (which MUST be used for at least one pass of recce prior to the event)

Championship/Series points will be allocated as per the relevant state Regulations. Results for Event awards will be established by adding the total elapsed time of all the special stages and any penalties incurred in all heats together.

Total Distance is 275.1km with 128.8km Competitive in 6 Special Stages.

#### 2.2.1 Heat 1

Commences from TC 1 and finishes at TC3A - Service In.

Total Distance is 113.6km, Competitive of 48.7km in 3 Special Stages with an optional remote refuel after 1 stage with 13.3km Competitive and 36km of transport.

#### 2.2.2 Heat 2 – Section 1

Commences at TC3C – Regroup Out at Corrigans Beach Reserve and finishes at TC4A – Service In.

Total Distance is 72.38km, Competitive of 44.74km in 1 Special Stage with 1 Service Break after 1 Special Stage

#### 2.2.3 Heat 2 – Section 2

Commences at TC4C – Regroup Out at Corrigans Beach Reserve and finishes at Stop Point SS6.

Total Distance is 89.17km, Competitive of 35.41km in 2 Special Stages.

#### 2.2.4 Entry Options

All crews entering the Bay Stages competition as part of the Rally of the Bay in a vehicle eligible to score Championship points, will be considered to be participating in the MTA NSW Rally Championship (NSWRC) for the allocation of trophies and championship points and no registration is required.

#### **Entering for a Victorian Championship/Series**

Crews wishing to be considered for the allocation of trophies and championship points in the Hino Geelong Victorian Rally Championship (VRC), Fiesta Rally Series Victoria and/or Grant Walker Parts Excel Rally Series must enter the Bay Stages event and MUST OPT-IN on the Entry Form to their selected Championship/Series, and be entered in a vehicle eligible under the applicable 2019 Victorian Rally Bulletin and Standing Regulations. These crews will, in addition to their opt-in selection(s), be automatically included in the MTA NSW Rally Championship awards & pointscore.

VRC crews are reminded that to be eligible for end of year awards in the VRC they must compete in a minimum of 50% of the available rounds.

#### 2.2.4.1 New South Wales Rally Championship (NSWRC)

Competitors who enter for the NSWRC will be eligible for:-

a) Outright Event Awards







- b) NSWRC Event Awards
- c) Points in the NSWRC
- d) Awards & Points in the East Coast Classic Rally Series (ECCRS) if eligible.
- e) Awards & Points in the ACT Regional Rally Series, if registered. These will be allocated based on the results of Special Stages 1 to 5 inclusive.

#### 2.2.4.2 Victorian Rally Championship (VRC)

Competitors who Opt-In on the Entry Form for the VRC will be eligible for:-

- a) Outright Event Awards
- b) VRC Event Awards (including Clubman, Novice, Excel & 2WD as eligible)
- c) Points in the VRC (including Clubman, Novice, Excel & 2WD as eligible)
- d) NSWRC Event Awards
- e) Points in the NSWRC
- f) Awards & Points in the East Coast Classic Rally Series (ECCRS) if eligible.
- g) Awards & Points in the ACT Regional Rally Series, if registered. These will be allocated based on the results of Special Stages 1 to 5 inclusive.

#### 2.2.4.3 Victorian Fiesta Rally Series

Series points will be allocated as per the Series Regulations.

Competitors who enter for the Fiesta Series will be eligible for:-

- a) Outright Event Awards
- b) Victorian Fiesta Rally Series Awards
- c) VRC Event Awards
- d) Points in the VRC
- e) NSWRC Event Awards
- f) Points in the NSWRC
- g) Awards & Points in the ACT Regional Rally Series, if registered. These will be allocated based on the results of Special Stages 1 to 5 inclusive.

#### 2.2.5 Apparel

As Per 2019 CAMS Manual Schedule D 2.2 Rally - Gravel State.

NOTE: This includes Frontal Head Restraint for ALL Competitors participating in this competition.

#### 2.2.6 Vehicle Eligibility

As per 2019 CAMS Manual – National Rally Code – Vehicles General (NRC VG) 1. Vehicle Eligibility. The Organisers may extend an invitation to compete to vehicles of special or significant historical value which do not necessarily fully comply with existing classes or categories.

#### 2.3.1 Section 1

Commences from TC 1 and finishes at TC3A – Service In.

Total Distance is 113.6km, Competitive of 48.7km in 3 Special Stages with an optional remote refuel after 1 stage with 13.3km Competitive and 36km of transport.

#### 2.3.2 Section 2

Commences at TC3C - Regroup Out at Corrigans Beach Reserve and finishes at TC4A - Service B In

Total Distance is 72.4km, Competitive of 70.7km in 2 Special Stages with 1 service break

#### 2.3.3 Section 3

Commences at TC4C – Regroup Out at Corrigans Beach Reserve and for results purposes finishes at the Stop Point of SS5. Competitors may then choose to compete on SS6 however their time on this stage will not be used in the determination of reults

Total Distance is 89.2km, Competitive of 26km (if only doing SS5), with an optional additional 9.4km for SS6

#### 2.3.4 Entry Options

Crews contesting the ACT Regional Rally Series may enter either the Bay Stages (6 stages – State Championship permit) or Bay Ramble (5 stages – Multi-Club permit) – the results for the ACT Regional Rally Series will be determined on only the first 5 stages of the meeting.

Crews who enter the Bay Stages event will be considered as finishers for the ACT Regional Rally Series when they complete Special Stage 5.

Inclusion in the ACT Regional Rally Series for awards and pointscore requires registration as per the series regulations.

#### 2.3.5 Apparel

#### 2.4.4 Rollover Protection

As per the CAMS Manual Rollover Protection is not compulsory for vehicles in this competition however the Organisers require that 4WD vehicles manufactured on or after 1<sup>st</sup> Jan 1986 that are turbocharged or supercharged must be fitted with CAMS approved roll over protection.

For all others Rollover Protection is recommended but not compulsory.

#### 3.3 \$100 Rebate for Provision of an Official

Competitors who provide the name, contact phone number and email address of a volunteer who will be available to travel independently to assist in the running of Special Stage 5 of the event (meet point time will be approximately 10:30am at Rally HQ) will, as long as their nominated official attends as rostered, receive a \$100 rebate of their entry fee within 14 days of the completion of the event. Nomination of this official is to be done via the event online entry form.

Nominated volunteers will NOT be available for either of the event Services.

To qualify for the rebate the nominated volunteer cannot have been a volunteer for any Rally of the Bay event in the past 3 years and must be at least 18 years of age.

#### 3.4 Starting Order

The starting order will be determined by seeding using the NSW Seeding list, the Victorian Seeding list and whatever other information the Organisers select. The seeded list of entries will be available as per the Event Programme.

To assist officials to determine Crew requirements regarding apparel, crews will be issued either a "State" or "Multi-Club" sticker to be affixed on the front left windscreen area adjacent to the small car number. Please refer to Appendix B.

The starting order for top 5 seeded Competitors in Bay Stages competition will be determined by a ballot conducted at the Event Competitors Briefing.

NOTE: Heat 1 will start from TC 1 and the official start list will show each crews provisional due time at TC 1.

#### 3.5 Change of Entry

Competitors may, at any time up to the close of Documentation Verification, change the vehicle or Crew Members upon written notification to the Clerk of the Course. A change of Driver or vehicle may necessitate the Competitor to be reseeded.

# 3.6 Crew Eligibility

Crews will comprise two persons only. The same Crew will be required to compete throughout the Rally.

#### 3.7 Competitors Briefing

A Competitors Briefing will be held at 0830hrs Saturday June 29, at the Ceremonial Start location. It is required that at least one member of the Crew attend, and be present for the entire duration of, this Briefing.







#### Article 4 DOCUMENTATION AND SCRUTINY

#### 4.1 Documentation

At Documentation Verification Drivers, Co-Drivers and Competitors will be required to present:

- Completed & signed Scrutiny Form
- CAMS Competition Licence
- CAMS affiliated Car Club Membership Competitor, Driver and Co-Driver
- Vehicle Log Book (where required)
- Drivers Civil Licence and Co-Driver's Civil Licence (except where exempted under National Rally Code Event General 2.1 (c) of the 2019 CAMS Manual)
- Vehicle Registration Papers and proof of Third Party Insurance.
- NSW UVP's will be considered as valid registration however Competitors are encouraged to have their vehicle under NSW (or similar) Rally Registration
- QLD registered vehicles will require a 3<sup>rd</sup> Party Extension
- Where the Electronic Entry Form is used, a disclaimer signed by the Competitor, Driver and Co-Driver must be presented by the close of Documentation.

Road Book, Service Instructions, Competition Numbers and Advertising, etc. will be issued at Documentation Verification.

Service crew personnel must be registered and signed in by the close of Documentation Verification.

Rallysafe Transponders will be issued at Documentation.

NOTE: A \$50 Cash Deposit will be required when collecting the Rallysafe Transponder. This will be returned to you when the Transponder is returned.

#### 4.2 Scrutineering

Competitors are requested to have their vehicles and apparel scrutineered by an accredited CAMS Scrutineer in the fortnight prior to the Event and to present a fully completed and signed road Event Scrutiny Form at Documentation. A copy of the form is included at the end of these Regulations if required.

Any Competitor who is unable to organise to be scrutineered as above must contact the Clerk of the Course as early as possible to make other arrangements.

The Organisers reserve the right to examine vehicles at any time during the Event and require compliance with the regulations before a vehicle can continue.

Post-Event scrutineering, for eligibility, may be carried out at the finish of the Event.

Four wheel drive vehicles whose engine is supercharged/turbocharged, must be fitted with a restrictor as per the CAMS Manual of Motor Sport and must be fitted with a CAMS approved seal.







Particular attention will be paid to a vehicle's presentation. Vehicles with body damage or unpainted panels will not be allowed to compete. Vehicles must be presented to the scrutineer clean and ready to start with all compulsory equipment, including auxiliary lights, included.

# 4.3 Timetable for Documentation and Scrutineering

As per the Event Programme.







#### Article 5 VEHICLES

#### 5.1 Exhaust Noise

All vehicles are required to conform to NRC VG 3.2 and may be tested in accordance with the method in the Rally Code.

#### 5.2 Safety

Safety requirements for the Crew and the vehicle will be as per the 2019 CAMS Manual of Motor Sport. Particular attention should be paid to Schedules A of the General Requirements for Cars and Drivers and the NRC VG.

# Article 6 EVENT DETAILS

#### 6.1 Rally Headquarters

Rally Headquarters will be located at the Coachhouse Marina Resort, Beach Rd, Batemans Bay.

#### 6.2 Reconnaissance

Competitors who have entered the Bay Meander found to be undertaking reconnaissance at any time will be referred to the CAMS and/or Stewards by way of a formal charge.

The course will be "open" for reconnaissance for those competing on pacenotes from Friday 31<sup>st</sup> May 2019 for Competitors who have lodged a completed, and paid, entry with the Organisers.

Competitors will be provided with an electronic version of the roadbook after their entry has been received and may register with the Organisers to undertake recce at any time prior to competition.

Competitors undertaking reconnaissance prior to Thursday 27<sup>th</sup> June 2019 are required to register the dates and times they wish to undertake recce via email to the Clerk of the Course – <a href="mailto:ian.bigg@gmail.com">ian.bigg@gmail.com</a> – and must provide details of the vehicle (Make, Colour & Registration) to be used.

Competitors found to be undertaking recce at 'unregistered' times will be referred to the CAMS and/or Stewards by way of a formal charge.

Reconnaissance on or after Thursday 27<sup>th</sup> June does not require notification however Competitors are reminded that Event Officials will be undertaking stage setup activities on these days and may be encountered at any point – and may be travelling in opposing direction.

The Event consists of 4 separate stages, two of which are repeated. Total unique special stage distance is 93.4km.

Competitors undertaking recce are reminded that:-

- 1) ALL road rules and limits are in force and are to be observed breaches will be referred to the CAMS and/or Stewards by way of a formal charge.
- 2) The maximum speed limit applicable on Special Stages and all other unsealed roads during reconnaissance shall be 60km/h and all crews are required to strictly adhere to this limit. Under NO circumstances are crews to travel in the opposite direction to the set course unless specifically instructed to do so by the Organisers.
- 3) The speed of the vehicles being used for reconnaissance may be monitored by Officials and any observed or reported speeding will be referred to the Stewards. Residents in the areas are aware of the Event and have been instructed to report any issues to the Clerk of the Course for investigation. We rely on the goodwill of these people to gain access to the roads in this area and they MUST be treated with respect.
- 4) During reconnaissance, roads WILL NOT be closed and crews are reminded that they DO NOT have priority over other road users. Members of the public may also be using these roads and may be travelling in opposing directions.
- 5) Crews are also reminded that the NSW Road Traffic Act will remain in effect for the duration of reconnaissance and that all road rules must be observed (e.g. complying with advisory signs, obeying speed limits imposed and keeping to the left). Officials may be on the course at any time to police these Regulations.

#### 6.3 Ceremonial Start

There will be a promotional start in a section of the Batemans Bay waterfront shopping precinct which all entered crews must attend -1<sup>st</sup> car departing at approximately 0845hrs on Saturday morning. This is NOT the official start of the event - Heat 1 will start from TC 1 and the official start list will show each crews provisional due time at TC 1.







#### 6.4 No Wheelspin Starts

In order to minimise the effect of the Event on Shire and Forestry roads, and in the interests of erosion control, No Spin Starts will be used for the start of all competitive stages. A zone will be defined for Drivers to adhere to. Wheel slip is permitted – excessive wheel spin is prohibited. Any Control Official shall be a Judge of Fact. For those who are not familiar, further explanation will occur at Drivers Briefing. Time Penalties will apply for any crew who breaches the no spin start.

#### 6.5 Overtaking (use of Rallysafe Push to Pass function)

Any crew intending to overtake another moving vehicle during a Special Stage must push the Pass button on the Rallysafe unit. If the car to be overtaken is within 200-250m (depending on terrain) it should receive a message that another car wishes to overtake them and the crew of this vehicle must then allow the other vehicle to pass at the first safe opportunity. Any refusal to allow another car to pass will be considered a breach of NRC EG 3.8

In the Event of a complaint of failing to allow another Competitor to pass, the Rallysafe transmission data is available to the Clerk of the Course and the Stewards of the meeting for consideration. This means the transmission of send/receive of overtaking messages in both vehicles can be reviewed by the Clerk of the Course for consideration of any penalty if required.

#### 6.6 Service Park In Controls and Final Time Control

Competitors may book into TC3A & TC4A (Service In Controls) early <u>without</u> penalty. The time allowed for service will commence from the later of the crews DUE time at TC3A/TC4A or their actual book in time.

#### 6.7 Servicing

All servicing will take place at the Service Park, Corrigans Beach Reserve, Batehaven. Please refer to the Location Map within these regulations. For reasons of Competitor and Service Crew safety, no Servicing or refuelling is permitted outside designated Service or Refuel Areas as identified in the Road Book.

Service Times will be as per the itinerary.

Service Park will be open as per the Event Programme and Service instructions will be issued at Documentation Verification.

All servicing must take place on a surface capable of capturing and retaining liquids which must not be allowed to enter the surface of the ground in the service area.

No service vehicle may drive on a competitive stage during the running of the Event without the express permission of the Clerk of the Course. If vehicle recovery is required, Service Crews are asked to contact rally headquarters for instruction.

Service Crew Members must be registered with the Organisers by the close of Documentation Verification. A form is provided with these regulations and copies will be available at Documentation Verification. Only registered Service Crew Personnel will be covered by CAMS Personal Accident Insurance for the Event. The maximum number of Service Personnel that can be registered per competing vehicle is eight.

There is pump fuel available near the Service Park.

Refuel distances and locations are as per Section 2.1.3 – Servicing.







#### Article 7 GENERAL INFORMATION

#### 7.1 Maps

All maps will be supplied by the Organisers.

#### 7.2 Odometer Check

The Odometer Check START 0 sign is on the Kings Highway headed West from Batemans Bay at the 100km/h speed sign just past the second roundabout. Directions for the 5km check will be included in the Road Book.

#### 7.3 Route Instructions

The Event is fully route charted.

Tulip diagrams will be provided, but the written instructions are to take precedence should any conflict in interpretation be encountered.

No closed gates will be encountered in special stages of the Event.

#### 7.4 Event Signage

It is a condition of entry that all competing cars display the Event signage as provided by the Organisers and this must be placed in accordance with Appendix B.

Any unauthorised variations from the specified locations may make the car & crew ineligible to score Championship and/or Series awards and points.

#### 7.5 Sunrise & Sunset

On Saturday, June 29 in Batemans Bay:

Sunrise 0710hrs
Sunset 1655hrs

#### 7.6 Penalties

Competitors are reminded of the penalties for exceeding speed limits. These penalties will apply in addition to any penalties imposed by NSW Police who will report any incidents involving Rally Cars and/or Service Vehicles to the Organisers.

#### 7.7 Results

The Clerk of the Course reserves the right to take into account any available information when compiling the results, including control cards, etc., and to correct any verified recording errors.

The results are official and final, at 07:00hrs June 30, 2019 should no protests on the results be received.

Protests must be lodged in accordance with Part XII of the current CAMS Manual.

#### 7.8 Finishing Qualifications

All Competitors must complete 100% of the route up to the final Stop Point for their event under the power of the competing vehicle to be classified as finishers and feature in outright results.

Any Crew that fails to report to any control or enters or leaves a control in other than the prescribed direction shall be deemed to have retired from the Event, the route being that as set out in the Road Book for each Crew.







# 7.9 Abbreviations

Abbreviations shall be as per the NRC









#### Article 8 SAFETY OF COMPETITORS

#### 8.1 Non-Injury Stoppage on a Special Stage or Closed Road Section

In the Event of a stoppage by a Competitor which requires no medical assistance the Competitor must:

- Immediately place triangles to warn following Competitors.
- Place the OK sign (on the rear of the Route Instructions) on the vehicle in such a position that it remains clearly visible to all following Competitors.
- If not causing an obstruction press the OK selection on the Rallysafe unit, if partially blocking the road etc. leave unit in Hazard mode to warn arriving vehicles.
- All Competitors stay as close to their vehicle as is safe to do so.
- If able to get the vehicle going, and wish to move it, do not leave the stage via another route proceed for the full length of the stage, in the correct direction.

#### 8.2 Accident involving Injury

Any Competitor involved in an accident requiring assistance for a trapped or injured Crew Member should:

- Press the manual SOS selection on the Rallysafe unit even if it has started an automatic SOS the manual confirmation will help HQ.
- Immediately place triangles to warn following Competitors (unless incapable of doing so).
- Display the SOS (on the rear of the Route Instructions) in a prominent position, visible to the next two Competitors.
- After the first two following Competitors, display the OK sign (on the rear of the Route Instructions) to the rest of the field.

Any Competitor coming on another Competitor involved in an accident must:

- Stop, if the SOS is displayed or if there is no visible sign displayed, and render assistance.
- If appropriate press the manual SOS selection on their Rallysafe unit as confirmation to HQ of the severity of the incident.
- If possible, contact Rally Command by mobile phone or radio, noting car number, cumulative distance to the accident site, and if known, general details of injuries sustained.
- If unable to contact Rally Command, write down the accident details, stop the next Competitor and have them proceed immediately to the next SOS point or Special Stage Stop Point with the accident details.
- At the first practical time, fill in an incident report fully detailing the incident, and pass it to the Clerk of the Course, or Control Official.

Failure to comply with these Regulations will result in a report to the Stewards. A penalty can be applied at the discretion of the Stewards up to and including exclusion.







#### Article 9 REMINDERS.

#### 9.1 Lighting of Fires

The lighting of fires at any time during the Event is strictly forbidden.

#### 9.2 Speed and Noise

Officials, who may be CAMS Observers and who will be Judges of Fact, may be appointed to measure the speed and noise of competing vehicles. All Competitors and Service Crews are advised that a CAMS approved Noise Meter and/or Radar may be in use on liaison sections and/or service access roads of the Event, to measure the noise and/or speed of competing vehicles and/or service vehicles. Penalties for Competitors will be as per the CAMS Manual of Motor Sport.

#### 9.3 Behaviour of service crews

Competitors will be responsible for ensuring that Service vehicles and Crews comply with NRC EG 4.4 and breaches will be referred to the Stewards who may impose a penalty.

#### 9.4 Retirements

Any Crew retiring from the Event must submit their road cards to the Stage End Control or the Sweep Car.

Accurate details of the reason for withdrawal and any damage to vehicles or other property must be supplied. An incident report must be completed if a Competitor or other person sustains any injuries and the organisers may require any crew to complete an accident report or other CAMS forms.

Any vehicle involved in an accident must be made available, at a time and place to be agreed, for inspection by a CAMS licenced Scrutineer prior to its participation in this or any other competition.

Failure to comply with these conditions may result in Competitors being referred to the Stewards and charges being laid under NCR 183(viii) in reference to these regulations and the requirements of Appendix I of the 2019 CAMS Manual of Motor Sport.

#### 9.5 Rejoining

Rejoining in accordance with NRC SSR 8 will be permitted in this Event at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course.

If the sweep vehicle catches up to a Competitor who would normally be considered 'out of late time' the Competitor may elect to either:

- withdraw, in which case they cannot participate further in the Event, and must hand in their time card and withdrawal form; or
- request to rejoin at a future point, in which case they must hand their current time card to the sweep vehicle and then proceed to the Event service park control and make application to rejoin. Vehicles must be approved by a scrutineer prior to being permitted to rejoin.

Any Competitor, who rejoins the rally in accordance with the above Regulations, will have stage results recorded in the results, but will not be classified as a finisher or eligible for any awards.

Competitors who fail to complete the first heat (if applicable) may rejoin at the start of the second heat and will be eligible to earn heat points. In this situation the crews "late time" limit will be reset for the second heat.

Rejoining will occur at the next available regroup following service.







#### Article 10 WHS ADVICE FOR ENTRANTS AND SERVICE CREWS

All personnel are asked to assess the risks associated with any practice that they are involved with, and take action to minimise the potential injury to themselves and any other personnel.

Please observe the following rules to assist our Event to be a safe one.

- No smoking within the Service Park
- Use a liquid proof ground sheet beneath the car during all servicing and re-fuelling operations.
- · Jack stands must be used when working under vehicle
- Suitable fire extinguisher required to be readily available when refuelling

#### Article 11 ALCOHOL, DRUGS AND OTHER SUBSTANCES

Any holder of a CAMS 'Competition' or 'Officials' licence (or equivalent licence issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of drugs (or other banned substances) and subject to a penalty(ies) for a breach in accordance with the CAMS Anti-Doping Policy and/or the CAMS Illicit Drugs in Sport (Safety Testing) Policy as published on the CAMS website. Consumption of alcohol in the paddock, pits or any section of the competition venue/course under the control of the Officials is forbidden until all competition is concluded each day. Accordingly, any holder of a CAMS 'Competition' or 'Officials' licence (or equivalent licence issued by another ASN) may also be tested for the presence of alcohol by a CAMS Accredited Testing Official (CATO) in accordance with the CAMS Standard Operating Procedure for Breath Alcohol Testing.











