It was a tremendous drive and Molly proved she was the match for some of the best drivers in the country beating both the Evans brothers on equal terms, setting fastest stage times in a display of speed and car control. As Molly will tell you she doesn't just want to be the fastest woman rally driver, she wants to be the fastest rally driver full stop. Well done Molly from everyone at North Shore. At the moment she is second in the ARC

heading to round two in Canberra in mid May with four rounds remaining and wouldn't it be fantastic if she could take the Championship and become not only the first woman to win the ARC outright as a driver but the first North Shore member to take the tittle.

Next Monday we will face our 2015 Annual General Meeting. It will be five years since I became president and I am reaching or some might say have already reached my use by date. It is time for someone else to step up to the role and take on the task of steering the good ship into the stormy waters of club motor sport in the future.

MOLLY TAYLOR MAKES HISTORY AND TAKES A PODIUM

North Shore member Molly Taylor has made history in the Australian Rally Championship, becoming the first female driver ever to win a heat in a round of the country's national rally series.

In their first event together – the Quit Forest Rally, run in WA over the weekend – Taylor and experienced co-driver Bill Hayes (Renault Clio R3) kept their heads while their rivals fell victim to the treacherous WA gravel or mechanical problems.

They won Saturday's first heat of the opening round of the 2015 ARC and came third on Sunday (March 28-29), giving them second place outright for the weekend, behind Eli Evans and Glen Weston (Citroën DS3 R3T). Eli's brother Simon Evans and co-driver Ben Searcy (Honda Civic Type R) completed the podium.

"To be honest, making history was the last thing on my mind but it is pretty cool!" Taylor said.

"And as far as being the only female driver competing against the guys, I don't think about that either. I'd feel the same way if Eli and Simon were women!" she chuckled.

"We're all competitors and when you're out there, you just want to be the best competitor, to make the best of whatever happens on the day and – hopefully – that's good enough to get a really good result.

"Obviously it's been a really fantastic weekend for us and we're pretty excited. I didn't know what to expect being away from competing in Australia for so long, and here we have Bill and I being in the car for the first time, and the first time together, and we've achieved a podium, which is a great result for everyone involved," Taylor said.

"I was putting a lot of pressure on myself but the car felt really good and we were happy with our pace from the start, so then we just decided to concentrate on getting our jobs right – and then everything came together and here we are!"

Despite the result, Taylor and Hayes were not without their own dramas. Coming into the final two stages of Heat One, the steering went on the Clio.



"The suspension arm just snapped just as we came into control and we had about five minutes to fix it before those two stages around Nannup Oval," Taylor said.

"We managed to jerry-rig the steering and the wheel with a couple of ratchet straps and then we drove, rather than rallied, the last stages. We were trying not to brake and not to turn too sharply and just nursed the car around, hoping we had enough time up our sleeves to keep the result. Thankfully we'd built up enough of a buffer through the day that we could sacrifice the time, but it was so nearly all over."

Taylor and Hayes also had some dramas on Day Two, with a puncture two kilometres from the end of the first stage. They drove out of the stage – uphill all the way – before changing the tyre, but it cost them valuable time.

"We spent the rest of the day trading times with Eli and Simon which was a lot of fun. We've learned a lot this weekend. We know we have the pace and we know what we need to do from here and we are really excited for the rest of the year. Bring it on!"

The 26-year-old, who is back home in Sydney after six years competing in the British, European and World Rally Championships, has paid tribute to Scott Pedder and the Pedders team, who own the car. Pedder and co-driver Dale

Moscatt won the Australian title in the Renault last year.

"I knew the car was good – Scott Pedder proved that last year – it was up to me to live up to how good it is. I want to thank him and all the guys in the team who have helped get me here this weekend.

"I'd also like to thank Bill [Hayes] for doing an awesome job in the car as well as my sponsors including Rexona and Hi Tec Oils – and everyone who has supported me. This result is truly the best way I can repay them," she said.

Taylor has been instrumental in helping Scott Pedder put together a programme to contest the WRC2 category of the World Rally Championship this year. Pedder returned the favour by arranging for Taylor to drive his car in the top level of local competition.

Taylor and Hayes' next outing with the Renault will be the National Capital Rally in Canberra in May.

During the young Sydneysider's time overseas, she was named British Ladies Champion two years in a row, won the inaugural European Rally Championship Ladies Trophy and was officially recognised as the fastest female rally driver in the world (2013). Taylor is working on plans to contest several WRC rounds in 2015, as well as the Australian championship.

YOO HOO JUHA CAN YOU COME TO CANBERRA?

While the inductees into the Australian Rally Hall of Fame are yet to be announced for 2015, The organising committee is very excited to have secured one of the greats of the rally world Juha Kankkunen as guest speaker.

Following on from the hugely successful inaugural and 2014 Rally Hall of Fame Gala Presentations, the RHoF Committee is proud to announce it has matched the high standard of guest speaker achieved last year in the globally popular Ari Vatanen. Fellow Finn Juha Kannkunen is a four times world champion himself and continues the tradition that has established the Rally Hall of Fame on the annual motorsport calendar.

The Gala Presentation will run in conjunction with the National Capital Rally, the second Round of the East Coast Bullbars Australian Rally Championship, on Thursday 14th May. "Last year's event proved a massive hit with Ari, so we are absolutely ecstatic to welcome Juha as our guest of honour for this year's gala awards," said the Hall of Fame Committee member Col Trinder.

Kankkunen was active in the World Rally Championship from 1983 until 2002,

including stints with Toyota, Peugeot, Lancia, Ford, Subaru and Hyundai. In 1986 he became the sports youngest ever Champion when he mastered the almighty Group B Peugeot 205, and then backed up his success the following year when he switched to a Lancia Delta.

Kankkunen, who has also competed in the Dakar Rally, the Pikes Peak Hillclimb and twice won the Race of Champions, is widely regarded for winning three of his four World Championships with different manufacturers, a result that has never been beaten. Organisers have urged the rally community to book early and avoid disappointment as many did in 2014 with Ari Vatanen. Tickets are strictly limited so get in early.

CARY SET TO UNLEASH HIS MINI IN CANBERRA

The development of NSSCC member Ric Cary's MINI has been progressing along piece by piece over the past eighteen months, which Cary admits has felt like a lifetime, but he's confident that he'll take the start line at the National Capital Rally to give the car its maiden outing.

"Baring plague, pestilence or nuclear holocaust, I'm certain we will be in Canberra," Cary laughed. "The car was basically ready back in September last year, but decided we need time to get it running perfectly and made the call to hold back until Canberra."

The former circuit racing MINI has been stripped, overhauled and setup for the rigors of gravel rallying, and as that process has unfolded Cary and his team uncovered hurdle after hurdle that kept knocking their completion date further into the future.

"It has been a long process, we are pretty much twelve months behind where we originally wanted to be. I didn't want to take the car out and waste our time and money though, I wanted to wait until the car was 100% ready before it hit the gravel properly," Ric said.

To help speed up development Cary ran the MINI at the new Twilight Rallysprints at Eastern Creek over the summer. "Every time we ran the car it improved out of sight, plus only being twenty minutes from home gave me the confidence that if something went wrong we didn't have far to go to get parts."

"The plan now is to pump a few events into the car, and the driver, between now and Canberra in May. I'm really looking forward to showing our faces at Nat Cap, it'll be great to finally show everyone all the hard work we've been doing," he added.

After such a long lead time Cary has every confidence that the car is going to be up to the job, but he does have a few lingering doubts about the guy behind the steering wheel. "I'm very happy with the car, now it's just a case of bedding in the driver!"

"I haven't driven a front-wheel drive in anger in more than 25 years! I've come from four-wheel drives where you can



afford to use the power to get yourself out of trouble, in these things you don't have that luxury," commented Cary.

"I'm expecting it'll take me a while to get a proper feel for driving the MINI flat out. I'm probably giving away more than 20 years in age to the guys I'll be competing against. So my aim? I'm just going to take it Round by Round and look after my own business and see where we end up come the finish."

"I'm pretty confident we'll get a couple of hundred kilometres out of the car without any trouble, bar of course a failure by the driver!" he joked.



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
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
