

<u>COVID-19 Event Update – 2 – 1 July 2020</u>

Motorsport Australia strongly encourages the download and activation of the Australian Government's 'COVIDSafe App' for all event participants.

Under NO circumstances should anyone with symptoms consistent with COVID-19 attend the event. This includes any fever, respiratory symptoms, shortness of breath, sore throat, cough, fatigue, or sudden loss of sense of smell. Under no circumstances should anyone attend the event if they have been;

- i. overseas in the previous 14 days; or
- ii. in contact with someone who has been overseas in the previous 14 days; or
- iii. in contact with a known COVID-19 positive case in the previous 14 days.

It is highly recommended that if any attendee exhibits symptoms consistent with COVID-19 prior to the event they should consider taking a COVID-19 test. Contact details for testing clinics in NSW can be found at this link: https://www.health.nsw.gov.au/Infectious/covid-19/Pages/clinics.aspx

If interstate, please seek out the equivalent clinics in your State.

In light of the introduction of a COVID-19 lock down of ten specific postcodes in Melbourne, namely 3012, 3021, 3032, 3038, 3042, 3046, 3047, 3055, 3060 & 3064. All people who live in or have visited those postcodes in the last **14 days must not attend the event**. If this causes an entered crew to now not be able to compete please advise the Event Secretary and your entry fee will be refunded. For competitors, please also refer to the COVID-19 items surrounding your Dual Occupant Vehicle Declaration and the **serious consequences for making a false declaration**. All other participants need to refer to their specific COVID-19 Briefing document to determine their current health status and COVID-19 risk profile and whether they should reconsider attending. All participants are reminded that non-compliance of the relevant Stage 3 Restrictions in Victoria could incur penalties from Victoria Police, and **this event may not be sufficiently covered by Motorsport Australia's insurance policy if there is a breach of Victorian law**. The Event Organising Team are expecting you to make the correct choice regarding attendance based on your individual set of circumstances.

The NSW Health Minister has advised "the State Government "would not accept" Melbourne residents breaching Victoria's new lockdown orders and sneaking over the border. As soon as you set foot in NSW, you'll be exposed to the possibility of six months jail and \$11,000 fine," he said."

Note: The Victorian COVID-19 situation is very volatile at the moment and more severe restrictions on movement may be invoked with short notice before the event. The Event Organising Team are closely monitoring the situation and further notices may be issued if the situation changes.
